Strong Wind Blowing With Peat From the West...

Brittany's Glann ar Mor distillery is set to release a peated single malt from their cute little stills. Glann ar Mor distillery, which started production in 2005 and released its first cask of Glann ar Mor Single Malt Breton Whisky in the spring of this year, is set to release a peated version called "Kornog".

Kornog in the Breton language means "*The West Wind*", a wind with an inexhaustible power, which blows all year long around the company's seaside warehouses.

The very first bottling of this peated Single Malt from Brittany will be available in a few days in very limited quantity, being drawn from a Single Cask, a first fill Bourbon barrel from which they expect to fill between 220 and 230 bottles.

In view of this limited quantity, **Kornog "Taouarc'h Kentan"** ("The first peated one" in the Breton language) will be available exclusively in the company's visitor centre situated in the "remote but magical site of the **Pen Lan** peninsula" ([click here to discover it](#)), 2 allée des Embruns, 22610 Larmor-Pleubian, France, or through our online shop tregorwhisky.com.
